ARNE PARISH'S JOURNEY TO A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

• A Neighbourhood Plan is a community-led framework for guiding the future development, regeneration and conservation of an area; it is designed to help us shape our future

- Arne Parish Council published its intention to produce a Neighbourhood Plan in July 2013
- Work started after seven working groups were formed in March 2014: Housing, Business and Employment, Environment, Health, Traffic Management and Accessibility, Crime and Policing and Community Well-Being
- In March 2014, a Steering Group of twelve members was formed to oversee the progress of the plan
- A Parish Survey was completed by 55% of households in October 2014
- Two highly successful and well-attended consultation evenings were held in April and November 2014
- Between March 2014 and May 2016, parish councillors and other volunteers in the seven working groups have met regularly. They have now completed their work

Shows the Neighbourhood Plan's preferred option to satisfy local Arne Parish housing need - two small sites either side of West Lane adjacent to the by-pass.

Shows the site for Purbeck District Council's preferred option in Arne Parish to satisfy Purbeck-wide need. Although Worgret is in Arne Parish, PDC's 'Summary of Proposed Sites' describes it as "West Wareham, 500 Homes; SANG*; contribution to existing/new school; road improvements; footpath and cycle links; small employment units; local shop; recreation space."

* SANG - Suitable Alternative Natural Green Space: increased access to green space
