

AN INTRODUCTION TO THE ROLE OF FALCONERS IN THE RECOVERY OF THE GREY PARTRIDGE (*Perdix perdix*) AND OF FARMLAND BIODIVERSITY IN EUROPE. WHY IS THE PERDIX PORTAL NECESSARY?

Across Europe, agricultural intensification has replaced complex ecosystems, such as the one below, with biodiversity-poor landscapes such as this one ...



This has reduced insect populations and havined the food webs that rely on them. As a result, grey partridge populations have suffered.
